Olympic Disciplines - Selection criteria

These selection criteria determine who can participate in international competitions as a member of Team Belgium

- 1 Athletes wishing to qualify for being part of Team Belgium and want to compete in international competitions should contact their technical director.
- 2 Before being able to apply, the athlete must
- 2.1 have obtained the Minimum Selection Score¹ in an official competition.
- compete in one of the following categories at regional and Belgian championships: youth category, men's 1, women's 1
- 3 Registered athletes must take part in competitions, training sessions and clinics to show their motivation.
- 3.1 participation in the Belgian Championship is required.
- 3.2 each federation decides what additional obligations to impose.

4 Selection points

- 4.1 The selection points to be achieved are calculated according to the method described in Annex1.
- 4.2 The list of selection points² is updated annually on 1 July.
- 4.3 The new points take effect for competitions from the following 1 January.

This list⁴ is drawn up each year at the end of November.

6 Belgian Ranking

- 6.1 Is updated monthly by the RBSSF General Secretary
- 6.2 Contains the scores obtained over the last 12 months in the competitions mentioned under art.5.
- 6.3 Is determined by the average of the 3 best scores.
- 6.4 Can be consulted on the websites of the various federations.

7 Participation in an international competition as a member of Team Belgium

- 7.1 To possibly be included in the regional, international or world selection, the required score must be achieved at least 3 times.
- 7.2 Each federation can impose additional criteria to be part of Team Belgium. For instance: engagement, motivation, achieving unique score, ...
- 7.3 The final decision on who will be selected for Team Belgium will be made by the Technical Director.
- 8 If at an international competition the number of starting places is limited, the best-placed athletes on the Belgian Ranking will be selected.
- 8.1 In ISSF and ESC competitions (European Championship, Grand Prix, World Championship, World Cup), the best placed participants in the Belgian Ranking will be included in the competition. All other participants will take part as RPO (Ranking Point Only).
- 9 When taking part in a team competition at an international competition, the team is made up of the highest ranked athletes in the Belgian Ranking.
- 10 Participating in an international competition at their own cost is allowed under the following conditions.
- 10.1 The competition must be included in the list of international competitions
- 10.2 Can for competitions in which we participate as Team Belgium but for which
- 10.2.1 The athlete has achieved the selection criteria but there are not sufficient (financial) resources at the federation to participate.
- 10.2.2 The athlete has not been selected. Only if it is possible to register individually. Not under Team Belgium.
- 10.3 Can be used for competitions in which we do not participate as Team Belgian but in which the athlete participates on his or her own initiative.⁵
- 10.4 If the athlete has achieved at least 1 x score regional (cfr current Belgian Ranking), the result will be included in the Belgian Ranking.
- 11 The final selection must be known before the expiry of the deadlines requested by the organisers.
- 12 Athletes who wish to change federation without mutual agreement must again obtain their selections for the new federation. This means that they will not be able to take part in international competitions
- 12.1 For at least 1 year.
- 12.2 Until they have met the criteria for the new federation.

⁵ The Technical Direction decides whether this can be done as Team Belgium (after achieving selection points) or in individual name.

Annex 1: Calculation method selection points

The scores – of the last 2,5 years – achieved in competitions organised by ESC, ISSF and IOC are noted in a table. More specifically the scores of following competitions are included: European Championships, Grand Prix, Word Cups, World Championships, European Games and Olympic Games.

The following data is maintained

- Competition name
- Number of Participants
- Score of place 8 (what is needed to reach a final place and by extension win a medal)
- Score of place 16
- Score of place 30

We obtain the following table (example from Air Rifle Women)

Based on this table, the selection points to be achieved are calculated

The Unique Score: rounded average of a final place (in the example: 628.0)

• The **World Score**: rounded average of the 16th and 30th places

(In the example: (627,00+625,11)/2 = 626,06 > rounded 626)

Athletes achieving these scores should be able to approach a top 20 place at these competitions.

The selection points International and Regional are calculated as a % of the World Score.

• International: certain % of the World Score. The % depends on the discipline

This % is determined, among other things, by whether or not there are changing conditions in which to shoot. E.g. Air Rifle is 99%, for Trap 97,5%, for other disciplines other percentages are

applied.

Regional: determined % of the International Score.

The % remains the same within the same discipline

The selection points to be achieved for juniors are the score of the top category 1 level lower in each case:

Unique score junior = World score seniors

World score junior = International score seniors

• International junior = Regional score seniors

Regional junior = % of international score juniors (the same % per discipline will continue to be used)

The **Minimum Selection Score (MSS)** is the minimum score to be achieved at an official competition before being allowed to participate in selection competitions.

The MSS is calculated as a percentage of the score regional junior
